OFFICIAL RULES

- Entry as a contestant in the Mattel Electronics* Intellivision* Intelligent Television/ WBZZ-FM VideoChallengeTM Tournament is only through presentation of the Official Entry form at the event. Entry forms must be filled out completely and legibly or they will be ineligible. Altered forms are invalid. NO TEAM WILL BE PERMITTED TO COMPETE IN THE VIDEOCHALLENGETM TOURNAMENT WITHOUT PRESENTATION OF AN OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM.
- The competition will be held at Century II Mail, Route 51 South in West Mifflin, PA. on Saturday, October 9, 1982.
- The competition is open to parents and their children—(Parent) an adult aged 18 or older who is the parent or legal guardian of a child. (Child) a person who is the child or ward of the parent or guardian identified on the application. Each team is to consist of one parent member and one child member. Proof of parental or guardian relationship with child may be required.
- Employees of Mattel, Inc., WBZZ-FM Radio, Century III Mail, RCA Corporation, Eastern Air Lines, Inc., Westin Hotel Co., Andiamo Inc., Eastman Kodak Company, Technidyne Corporation, the New American Library, Inc., TRG Communications, Inc., their agencies, affiliates, and respective amilies are not eligible.
